## Background

Anecdotal reports from Europe have suggested that vaccinating horses with a ringworm vaccine can reduce the severity of sweet itch signs.

The vaccine course comprises two injections, two weeks apart.

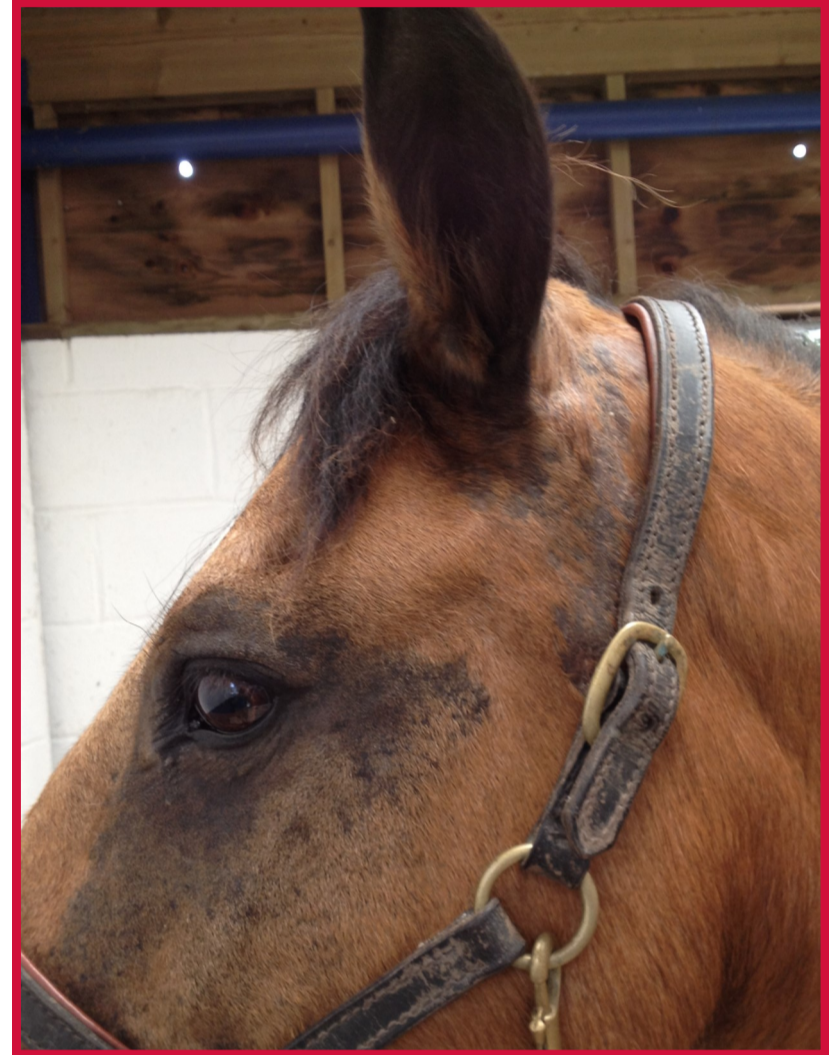
## 2018 results

Penbode Equine Vets ran a successful trial in 2018 and will be continuing to import the vaccine from Germany under a special licence.\*

Over 60% of horses given the vaccine in 2018 showed an improvement in their sweet itch signs.

## Conditions of use

- The horse/pony must be the property of, or kept by, a registered client of Penbode:
- We must visit and examine the horse/pony in the first instance, and a special consent form must be signed.
- The vaccine must be paid for in advance.
- Normal visit charges will apply
- It is necessary to start the vaccine course before the sweet itch season is in full swing.
- We recommend you continue to use all other methods of sweet itch control alongside the vaccine.
