Catterall

Catterall is a growing village and civil parish in Lancashire with an electorate of just over 1800 adults. Catterall is served by Wyre Council and Lancashire County Council with which the Parish works to ensure services are delivered to local residents.

The Council

Catterall Parish Council has 10 councillors and employs a part time Clerk who is based in an office at Catterall Village Hall and a part time Lengthsman.

The Lengthsman will report to the Clerk on a daily basis and the parish council will select one councillor to liaise with the Lengthsman on a weekly basis.

The purpose of the parish council is to maintain and improve the quality of life for Catterall residents by keeping the village neat and tidy, carrying out environmental improvements and providing some services and facilities. Responsibilities

The Parish Council owns Catterall playing field and the Multi-Use Games Area , the toddler and young children play area and the fitness trail which has recently been installed. Future plans include an older children's adventure play area and a wheeled play area for which grant funding has been obtained.

The Parish Council also owns a piece of land on Keeper's Wood Way, the war memorial at the junction of Garstang Road and Cock Robin Lane as well as a bus shelter, notice boards and seats around the village.

Parish Council Meetings

The Parish Council meets on the first Tuesday of the month and there are also Committee Meetings which are held as required. The Parish Lengthsman is not normally required to attend these meetings.

Training and Equipment

The parish council will provide all necessary training required to carry out the role. This includes health and safety, first aid, weed spraying, highway working and training to erect the Speed Indicator Sign around the village.

The parish council will also provide the required PPE in line with health and safety regulations and the tools and equipment required to carry out the post. On occasion equipment may be hired instead of provided.

The postholder must provide their own vehicle which is suitable for the requirements of the post.

Probationary Period

The post will be subject to a probationary period of 6 months.
